After some time away from the church, author Donald E. Miller returned to the fold. He writes: "One thing that brought me back ... was asking simply: What are the alternatives to the church?

Where are the communities that sanction the pursuit of meaning and truth as a legitimate enterprise? That have material and personal resources to assist in this search? That provide regular occasions for confession of failures? That renew and inspire? That provide a setting where children are nurtured? Where family members can be buried? Where births can be celebrated? Where social issues can be debated?"

Miller concludes: "There are a number of institutions that deal with one or several of these questions, but historically the church has demonstrated its ability to energize all of these activities."



From Childrens' Sunday School Mrs. Kate--Since Christmas we have been following Jesus as he was baptized and began his ministry. We have been talking about what it means *to believe* - to know in your heart what is true about God and faith. We have met people who believed in Jesus like his 12 disciples, John the Baptizer and all those who came to listen to him. We have also been 'wondering' about the miracles that Jesus was able to perform, such as walking on the water and healing many sick people. Soon we will join in the journey to Jerusalem and the events of Holy Week. The gift of Bibles presented to Amelia, Carter and AJ on Feb 26th was a special joy. May they always find peace, comfort, strength and encouragement in God's Words.

From Adult Sunday School -- The Adult Sunday School Class continues its study of the Gospel of Mark. We have pondered how, if Mark's gospel were the only gospel we had, our celebration of Christmas might be different if indeed we celebrated it at all, as Mark does not address the birth of our Lord.

We have talked about the possibility that John the Baptist may have been a Nazirite, and about Jesus teaching and healing people. In our last class, we talked about some of Jesus's parables, and how they are simultaneously simple and complex, and lead us to think deeply. In coming weeks we will continue our study of Mark, as Jesus continues His ministry and eventually faces His arrest, trial, crucifixion, and resurrection.
